




Figure 1 : Epoxy glass hard tissue, board thickness 1.5 mm, $R_{thJA}\!\leq\!100$ K/W




Figure 2: Thermal Resistance vs. Lead Length




Figure 3: Average Forward Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Figure 4 : Average Forward Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Figure 5: Reverse Current vs. Junction Temperature

Figure 6: Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage





Figure 7: Diode Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage
