




Figure 1. Gate-controlled turn-on time





Figure 2. Circuit-commutated turn-off time





AVERAGE ANODE ON-STATE CURRENT DERATING CURVE




SURGE ON-STATE CURRENT vs

CYCLES OF CURRENT DURATION




MAX CONTINUOUS ANODE POWER DISSIPATED vs





GATE TRIGGER VOLTAGE vs








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

CIRCUIT-COMMUTATED TURN-OFF TIME vs




